## Visitors

It has around 15.5 million inhabitants, including its metropolitan area. Buenos Aires receives an average of 2.8 million visitors per year, with this figure expected to reach 3 million by 2025.



## General information

Located in the municipality of Ezeiza, 35 km from downtown Buenos Aires. Buenos Aires is the capital and most populated city in Argentina. Located in the Pampas region besides the Rio de la Plata, its altitude of about 23 meters above sea level gives it a generally temperate and humid climate



## The airport

1. It has two runways with a maximum length of 3,300 meters and three terminals: A for international arrivals; B for international and domestic departures; and C for national departures and arrivals and international boarding gates on the first floor.
2. It is mainly used for commercial purposes, but it is also home to the Argentine Navy's Ezeiza Naval Air Station.
3. The country's immigration control operates online under the Immigration Department's Comprehensive Immigration Capture System (Sicam). It is carried out by inspectors, equipment, and modern technology, including self-service biometric gates.
4. Customs control is carried out just before leaving the airport and is monitored by a scanner to detect undeclared goods.
5. Security is provided by the Airport Security Police.



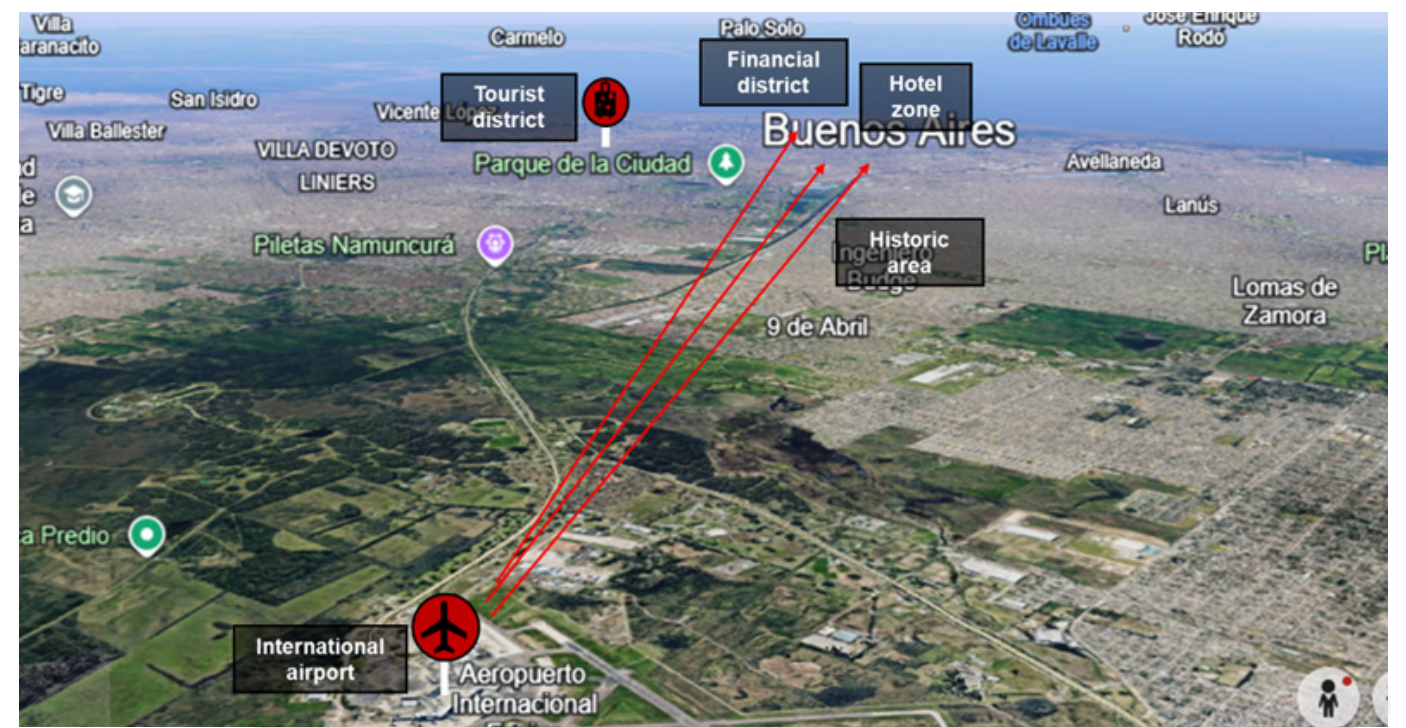

## Some requirements Argentina has for travelers are:

- Valid passport or national identity document if you are a citizen of MERCOSUR.
- Visa (if applicable).
- Reciprocity fee (if necessary).
- Return ticket or onward travel ticket.
- Yellow fever vaccination, for passengers from tropical countries.
- Digital Immigration Form (online 48 hours before travel).

## Traffic

Rush hour traffic in Buenos Aires:  
7:30-9:30 a.m. and 5-7:30 p.m.

- Microcentro (Financial district), take RN A002. Drive from Au 25 de Mayo towards Buenos Aires. Take the Av. Ing Huergo exit. Continue along Av. Paseo Colón.
- Puerto Madero (Hotels), drive from Au 25 de Mayo towards Buenos Aires. Take the Av. Ing Huergo exit from Au 25 de Mayo. Head towards Av. Alicia Moreau de Justo towards Juana Manso.
- Recoleta (Tourist district) access AU Tte. Gral. Pablo Riccheri/RN A002. Drive from Au 25 de Mayo towards Buenos Aires. Take the Av. Ing Huergo exit. Continue along Av. Paseo Colón, Av. Leandro N. Alem, Av. del Libertador, and Av. Pueyrredón towards Av. Gral. Las Heras in Comuna 2.
- San Telmo (Historic area) take AU Tte. Gral. Pablo Riccheri/RN A002. Take the exit towards 1/Constitución Avellaneda from Au 25 de Mayo. Take the exit for Av. San Juan. Take Bolívar towards Av. Caseros.



## Weather conditions



12°C in winter (June to September).



25°C in summer (December to February).



## RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Avoid exchanging currency at the airport upon departure.
2. Keep your luggage always secure.
3. Be wary of unauthorized vendors or people who offer cheaper services.
4. Use an E-Sim with data or a VPN when you are giving private information, avoid the airport's free WiFi.
5. Make sure you have packed your own luggage.
6. Do not carry other people's packages or luggage.
7. Check your luggage before leaving the baggage claim area.
8. Plan your trips to and from the airport in advance to arrive wherever you need to on time.
9. Do not take big amounts of cash with you.
10. Have a security team if you handle sensitive information.
