General information

Located in the Canton of Alajuela, approximately 17 km west of downtown San José.

San José, the capital and urban heart of Costa Rica, is in the Central Valley of the country, surrounded by green mountains and volcanoes. At an altitude of 1,170 meters above sea level, it has a temperate tropical climate



The airport

1.It has a main runway measuring 3.012 meters in length. On exceptional occasions, it may be used by state aircraft, but it is not designated for military use. 2. There are two main terminals: The international terminal, with 13 boarding bridges and the domestic

3. The Dirección General de Migración y Extranjería oversees the entry and exit of travelers, conducting passport checks, visa verification (if applicable), and biometric data screening. It also includes special procedures for minors and transit passengers. 4.Customs control is conducted by the Customs Authority, with random inspections and targeted checks on restricted or prohibited items (such as cash, food, natural products, etc.). There are separate lanes for passengers with and without goods to declare.

5. Airport Police, private security companies, and specialized units ensure constant surveillance, using X-ray scanners, metal detectors, and canine units at control points. Biosecurity inspectors have also been introduced to strengthen health measures.





Some requirements Costa Rica has for travelers are:

- -Valid passport
- -Visa (required for some nationalities, e.g., Colombian citizens)
- -Proof of onward or return ticket
- -Yellow fever vaccination certificate (for travelers arriving from high-risk countries as defined by international
- -Recommended vaccinations: Typhoid fever and Hepatitis A
- -Proof of financial solvency

Rush hour traffic in San José: 6:00 AM - 10:00 AM 4:30 PM - 6:30 PM

- . Downtown San José: Take Autopista General Cañas (Route 1) southeast continue along Paseo Colón connect with Avenida Central, 25-50 minutes depending on traffic.
- 2. Escazú / Santa Ana: Take Autopista General Cañas exit to Ciudad Colón / Autopista Próspero Fernández (CR-27) continue to Escazú, 30-60 minutes.
- 3. Heredia: Take Route 3 (Carretera a Heredia) directly from Alajuela,
- 4. Financial District (Sabana Norte): Take Autopista General Cañas exit at Rotonda de la Bandera take Paseo Colón to La Sabana.
- 5. Free Trade Zones (UltraPark, Lindora): Take Autopista General Cañas continue onto Autopista Próspero Fernández exit to Lindora, 40-70 minutes.
