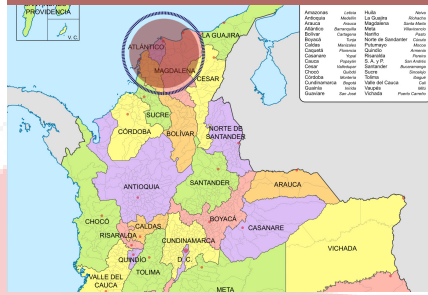


Rafael Núñez International Airport – CTG



Visitors

- The city has approximately 1.3 million inhabitants, including the district and metropolitan area.
- Cartagena receives an average of 4 million visitors per year.



General information

Located in the northern part of the city, in the Crespo neighborhood, Rafael Núñez International Airport handles over 7 million passengers, making it the most important airport on the Colombian Caribbean coast and the third busiest in the country in terms of passenger traffic.

Cartagena is a renowned Caribbean destination. Its historic center, the Walled City, was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1984. The city is at sea level and has a warm semi-arid climate.



The airport

- 1.The airport features a 2,600-meter-long runway and a single terminal, used primarily for passenger transport and occasionally for cargo.
- 2.Immigration control is managed by Migración Colombia and the Cartagena Air Migration Center.
- 3.Colombian citizens over 12 years old can enter using biometric identification through the Biomig system.
- 4.Customs control is conducted just before leaving the airport. International travelers must complete DIAN Form 530 only if they exceed the allowed limits for non-commercial goods.
- 5.Security is handled by the National Police and the Civil Aviation Authority.

Some requirements Colombia has for
travelers are:

- Valid passport or national identity document if you are a citizen of a MERCOSUR country.
- Visa (if applicable).
- Return ticket or onward travel ticket.
- Yellow fever vaccination if coming from Amazonian countries or planning to visit the Colombian Amazon.
- Check-Mig form.

Traffic

Peak traffic hours in Cartagena are from 6:00–8:00 AM and 6:00–8:00 PM.

1. Bocagrande: Upon exiting the airport, take Calle 70 merge onto Avenida Santander southwest / Route 90A continue along Avenida San Martín.
2. Financial District: Upon exiting the airport, merge onto Calle 70 take Avenida Pedro de Heredia continue along Calle 29D.
3. Ciudad Amurallada: Upon exiting the airport, take Calle 70 take Carrera 1 / Avenida Santander / Route 90A merge onto Carrera 2 / Playa de la Artillería continue along Calle 31.



Weather conditions



27°C throughout the year. September and October tend to be cloudy and rainy.



27°C throughout the year. November to February are the windiest.



RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1.Keep your personal belongings always secure, both inside and outside the airport.
- 2.Use only trusted transportation apps with verification codes.
- 3.Avoid discussing travel plans, business, or strategies in the vicinity of the airport or other public areas.
- 4.Do not carry jewelry, large amounts of cash, or high-value items visibly or in checked luggage.
- 5.Use a paid E-SIM or VPN instead of the airport's free Wi-Fi.
- 6.Avoid exchanging currency outside the airport facilities.
- 7.Avoid public charging ports due to potential data theft via USB ports.
- 8.Digitize and securely store copies of your documents to facilitate airport procedures.
- 9.Be cautious of strangers offering help with procedures or luggage, especially if they do not have official airport identification.
- 10.Always keep your personal documents with you, and if possible, have a secure digital copy.
