



General information

Located in the municipality of Soledad, 7 km south of downtown Barranguilla, it is the fifth most important airport in the country in terms of passengers and the fourth in terms of cargo. Barranquilla is the main commercial hub of Colombia's Caribbean region, as it has the most important river port in this region, located at the mouth of the Magdalena River.

The city is located on the western bank of the Magdalena River, so its altitude varies between 0 and 140 meters above sea level. It has a dry tropical climate



The airport

1.It has a terminal divided into two piers, one for domestic flights and the other for international flights. The runway is 3001 meters long and 45 meters wide.

2.It has three parking platforms, one for commercial passenger aircraft, another for cargo aircraft, and the last one for the military base. 3. Immigration control in the country is handled by Migración Colombia and the Barranguilla Immigration Center, which has an Immigration Services Facilitation Center (CFSM). 4.Colombians over the age of 12 are allowed to enter using biometrics through the Biomig

system. 5.Customs control is carried out before leaving the airport. International travelers must consider DIAN Form 530 only if they exceed the allowances for non-commercial goods. 6. Security is the responsibility of the National Police and the Civil Aviation Authority.



Some requirements Colombia has for travelers are:

- Valid passport or national identity document if you are a citizen of a MERCOSUR country.
- Visa (if applicable).
- Return ticket or onward travel ticket.
- Yellow fever vaccination if coming from Amazonian countries or planning to visit the Colombian Amazon.
- Check-Mig form.

Peak traffic hours in Barranguilla: 6:00-9:00 AM and 4:30-7:00 PM.

- •North Zone (El Prado hotel district): upon leaving the airport, take Calle 17/Vía Alterna al Puerto merge onto Calzada de la Cordialidad cross the Pumarejo Bridge over the Magdalena River take the exit towards Av. Murillo continue on Carrera 52.
- •Buenavista (financial district): when leaving the airport, take Calle 17/Vía Alterna al Puerto merge onto Calzada de la Cordialidad cross the Pumarejo Bridge over the Magdalena River continue on Av. de las Américas/Carrera 57 turn onto Calle 85.
- •Historic Center: when leaving the airport, take Calle 17/Vía Alterna al Puerto merge onto Calzada de la Cordialidad cross the Pumarejo Bridge over the Magdalena River take the exit towards the Center/Historic Center via Vía 40 or Avenida del Río merge onto Avenida del Río/Carrera 57B.
